

Acceptable Trees and Shrubs According to Wildview Design Guidelines

Note: All plantings must be approved by Design Review Committee. Approval is subject to appropriate location of plant materials.

Trees, Conifers

Minimum: 5 foot height or larger

Limber Pine	<i>Pinus flexilis</i>
Austrian Pine	<i>Pinus nigra</i>

Douglas Fir	<i>Pseudotsuga menziesii</i>
Colorado Spruce	<i>Picea pungens</i>

Trees, Deciduous

Minimum: 2" caliper or larger

Ornamentals: 10' height or larger

Specimen planting: 5' height or larger

Hedges and screening: 5 gallon container
